During both days Bishop Declan will commission pupil members of chaplaincy teams for the coming year. **New members** of chaplaincy teams will be presented with their badges. It is an opportunity for pupils to come together and share what they do.

Primary schools: Schools in attendance at the Cathedral will receive a chaplaincy training pack to take back to the school, filled with activities for chaplains and ideas for chaplaincy events the school can put in place for the school year ahead.

Secondary schools: After the commissioning service, Louise will run activities about the work and duties of a secondary school chaplain. Pupils will then have time for lunch.

Please note all badges, both new and replacement, will be provided at a cost to the school of £1.00 per badge.

Schools must submit total number of pupils attending by **Friday, 29th September 2023 (for primary schools)** and **Friday, 20th October 2023 (for secondary schools)** following which we will allocate any spare places. **Unfortunately, schools who have not submitted numbers before this date will not be permitted to attend.**

Aims of the Course

To:

- provide support in understanding the new RE Directory;

Modular Themes

Day 1: **Revelation** – Teaching RE in a Catholic school

Day 2: **Celebration** – Sacramental life and prayer in a Catholic school

Day 3: **Life of Christ** – The distinctive nature of the school

The fourth theme of Church will span across all three days.

A programme designed to develop and support teachers in their theological and practical RE knowledge. The course takes the four major documents of Vatican II, as outlined in the new RE Directory and considers their implication both for teaching and the life of the school. It aims to be practical as well as enhance subject knowledge. The course is suitable for primary staff, including teaching assistants, who may not hold a formal qualification in RE or who may wish to deepen their understanding of Catholic thought and theology.

Aims of Course

To:

- develop a clearer understanding of the key themes outlined in the new RE Directory and how this might affect the teaching of RE;
- promote practical strategies and ideas to support RE provision (both classroom RE and the Religious understanding gained through the life of the school as a whole);

- develop a deeper understanding of key scriptural pieces of text specifically linked to liturgical seasons and the Church's teachings;
- consider the nature of Sacraments;
- provide a deeper understanding of the distinctive nature of a Catholic school.

Closing date for bookings: Friday 19th January 2024.

NB: This course will not run unless we have a minimum of 10 participants.

CCRS for Teachers

A Brief Outline of the Certificate

The Catholic Certificate in Religious Studies (CCRS) is managed and awarded by the [Board of Religious Studies](#) on behalf of the Bishops' Conference.

It was introduced in 1991 to replace its predecessors, The Catholic Teachers' Certificate and the Certificate in Religious Education. Any teacher who is, or who wishes to be involved in Catholic Education may apply for the course.

The course seeks to ensure that participants have at least a basic knowledge and understanding of the beliefs of the Catholic Faith. It also provides a basis for further study. The course consists of eight modules in total: six core modules and two specialist modules. The core modules are: Old Testament; New Testament; the Person of Jesus; the Church; Sacramental Life; and Moral Understanding. Each module requires 10 hours contact time with a written assignment of 1500 words. You may of course choose to do the modules out of interest and not complete the written assignment; however, you will not be awarded a CCRS certificate unless you complete the written assignments.

“This month the new Religious Education Directory (RED), is being included and the new inspection framework for Section 48 will begin next month. This is an opportunity to improve the quality of Religious Education for our students. Some schools have volunteered to pilot some of the work of the new RED over the next academic year. The new framework requires an understanding of scripture, aspects of Catholic theology and practice, the way faith and life are connected and the importance of respect and dialogue with others.

I would encourage you, the senior leaders teams and RE staff to take advantage of all opportunities provided for training and where possible consider the Catholic Certificate in Religious Studies (CCRS). I know that the modules are being slightly adapted to ensure they cover all aspects of the new framework.”

Practical details

Facilitator: Louise White, RE Adviser

Speaker: Ann Fowler, RE Consultant

Timing: The certificate is normally acquired over two years with a maximum of five years' study. The diocese will offer four modules a year on a two-year cycle. Each year will consist of three core modules and a specialist module. You may choose to do four modules per year to complete the course over two years or you may space it out over a longer period if you wish. Once you begin the first module you must complete within five years. This academic

year will consist of eight days in total with four days in school time and four days on a Saturday.

Assessment: To gain accreditation you must attend each module and successfully complete an assignment. In this year we will consider: The Old Testament, New Testament, Person of Jesus and our specialist module will be Theology of Inclusion. You are welcome to attend the sessions without seeking accreditation through the submission of essays.

Cost: Registration fee £20 to be paid when returning Application Form. In addition, each module will carry a separate fee as indicated in the schedule to cover relevant expenses.

Chaplaincy Day for Primary & Secondary Schools on 22nd September 2023

Speakers: Susan Kambalu and Beth Friery, CAFOD

The new CSI framework provides opportunities for school chaplains to demonstrate the many ways that you support the Catholic life and mission of your primary and secondary schools. This day with CAFOD will highlight some of the ways in which our resources and activities can support you in this mission. This will include taking part in elements from a discipleship, mission and vocation workshop, using our resources to explore the purpose and methods of campaigning in school, and being reminded of our many other resources (including the Live Simply Award) that we hope will help your children and young people to respond to Pope Francis's call not to observe life from a balcony, but to go out and fly.

Chaplaincy Days for Secondary Schools

Day 1: Chaplaincy in the New Inspection Framework

Chaplains will discuss and explore the role and contribution made by Chaplains in secondary schools. We will share best practice which will support them in their important ministry.

Day 2: Theme and guest speaker to be confirmed.

After the main speaker, Jason Charewicz from Clifton Diocese's Adult Education Department will talk about the Faith in Action Awards.

Day 1 morning: Contemplative imaginative prayer

Maria has delivered contemplative, imaginative prayer and photograph sessions for over 11 years. She has 21 years' experience of working in primary education. She will lead a session entitled "Seeing with the eyes of your heart" on imaginative prayer and contemplative photography.

Day 1 afternoon: Christmas in a Box
Speakers: Liz Ogborne and Jane Gillis

'Christmas in a Box' with Liz Ogborne and Jane Gillis from the Bristol Schools Connection will be introducing a church/school-based resource for Christmas. The resource is suitable for Year 3 and above. 'Easter in a Box' will follow on Day 2 – 17th January 2024.

Day 3: CST in the primary curriculum
Speaker: Beth Friary, CAFOD

This session will look at Catholic Social Teaching and how it is an inherent part of the Catholic life and mission of the school. It will make links with key documents such as the RE Directory and the Inspection Framework. The session will include tools, activities, and printed resources to take back to school and implement straight away, inspiring and supporting the living out of CST for the whole school community.

Beth Friary is the CAFOD's Primary CPD Coordinator on the Education Team. She has been delivering CPD for CAFOD in locations across England and Wales for six years, inspiring teachers and their pupils to work for global justice and to act in solidarity for the common good. She was part of the writing group for the new RE Directory. Before working at CAFOD, Beth was a primary teacher, RE Coordinator, and lay chaplain, with specialisms in Early Years education and music. With Catholic social teaching at the heart of CAFOD's work, Beth works with schools, dioceses, MATs and Senior Leadership Conferences to embed Catholic Social Teaching within the Catholic life and mission of the school.
